with Abraham Lincoln. The Global Slavery Index (2016) estimates that 45.8 million men, women and children are enslaved around the world, including in our own back yard. In Australia, slaveholders are using people against their will for their own profit or advantage. Sometimes people are hidden behind closed doors; sometimes they are hidden in plain sight. WHAT IS FAIRTRADE







Fairtrade is about decent working conditions, stable prices, and the empowerment of farmers and workers around the world. Choosing Fairtrade Certified products means helping farmers and workers get paid fairly, and receive additional funding for vital projects to positively transform their communities and guarding against modern slavery.

In other words, Fairtrade is about creating a real, positive difference in people's lives, from the farmers and workers growing crops and producing raw materials, right through the supply chain to the place where you buy the end product.

HOW CAN YOU GET INVOLVED?

The sky's the limit and your creativity is welcomed! Here are 4 ideas to get you started ...

Help educate others about modern slavery and how Fairtrade helps

- Invite a guest speaker to share more about modern slavery globally and in Australia and why Fairtrade is an important step to preventing it
- Arrange a stall for a lunchtime during Fairtrade week where you can make Fairtrade goodies such as tea, chocolate, baked goods and have information available to help spread the word
- Arrange with your school canteen to replace or introduce any product that has a Fairtrade alternative during Fairtrade week and put up posters explaining why
- You may also like to donate the proceeds (See suggestion 3)

Make a personal commitment to switch to Fairtrade and share your reasoning with others

You have the power to make an individual difference by swapping a regularly consumed product (such as a morning tea or coffee) to a Fairtrade alternative. Then educate others by telling them why - as well as talking to people face to face, share your reasons on social media using **#endmodernslavery** and **#fairtradeweek**



Fundraise for victims of modern slavery in Australia

The Australian Freedom Fund is operated by The Salvation Army Freedom Partnership-to End Modern Slavery. The Fund supports victims in Australia to access basic services such as shelter, transport, food and emergency medical care. You can decide how you'd like to fundraise, or you could:

- 1. Hold a Fairtrade Bake Sale: Replace ingredients of some classics like chocolate brownies with Fairtrade ingredients
- 2. Hold a Fairtrade Stall: Sell Fairtrade products to the rest of the school in an accessible place. Eg. Schools in the past worked with Oxfam (oxfam.org.au) to source Fairtrade products and sell them to raise funds.



Become a Fair Trade School



This is a longer term commitment but Fairtrade week is the perfect time to start! Becoming a Fair Trade school means that your school is a leading example in ending modern slavery. You can gain accreditation in 3 easy steps: switching 2 products used by your school to a Fairtrade alternative, promoting Fairtrade throughout the school community, and hosting one Fairtrade focused event per year.
